

The Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) is one of the most sensible aspects of our tax code and provides a tax credit for working families who struggle to make ends meet. The EITC allows returning veterans, farm workers, home health aides, teaching assistants, janitors, cashiers and other low-wage workers to keep more of their hard-earned income.



The EITC helps about 27 Million¹ working American families

afford the basic necessities, such gas money to get to work and making sure there is food on the table.



The EITC is a good way to help families going through a tough time, like a temporary job loss

or a cut in hours, stay on their feet.



The EITC is a sensible, short-term solution to support Americans who are already working or seeking work.

Most recipients claim the EITC for short periods – typically only one or two years.



The EITC is good for businesses, workers and the entire community. For every EITC dollar a recipient earns, they return \$1.50-\$2.00 to the economy, supporting not only their families but also their communities.²
